About the RoHS directive – prohibition of hazardous substances

RoHS stands for "Restriction of the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment" and thus prohibitions or restrictions on hazardous substances such as cadmium, lead and mercury in electrical and electronic equipment. Ever shorter product lifecycles with a simultaneous increase of electrical and electronic devices placed on the market have led to increased disposal requirements every year. The EU Directive 2011/65/EU supplements the WEEE-Directive on the disposal of electrical and electronic equipment and aims to limit the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment.

RoHS Compliance

RoHS Compliance means conformity to Directive 2011/65/EU of the European Parliament and the Council of 8 June 2011, on the restriction of the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment. It restricts the use of the following six substances: lead, cadmium, mercury, hexavalent chromium, polybrominated biphenyls, and polybrominated diphenyl ether.
